MICHAEL ANDRADE is a licensed funeral director and embalmer who has worked in funeral service for 20+ years. His experience includes Oakdale Mortuary, Riverside Care Center, and the San Diego Medical Examiner's office where he became a Forensic Autopsy Specialist. He is a graduate of Cypress College and has extensive experience in embalming, crematory management, and all other aspects of funeral service, including supervision of a care center caring for 4,000 - 5,000 cases per year, Michael is the Dodge Sales Representative for West Central California [Santa Barbara, Ventura, Los Angeles and Orange Counties] and Hawaii.

Tumor Removal for a Natural Appearance - This case focused on an autopsied forty-seven-year-old male with tumor growth and severe decomposition. Following our initial pre-embalming evaluation of the body, we found that there may be undisclosed neoplasms. We carefully removed the abnormal tissues without cutting through the skin. The use of Inr-Seel allowed us to achieve a more natural appearance. Class participants will be introduced to other sutures to close the cranial incision, the practice of undercutting tissues at the base of incisions to prevent leakage, and use of various products to achieve the desired outcome.

Masking Postmortem Stain - At the conclusion of this session, participants should better understand the application of cosmetics on a male without it being overdone. Additionally, they should develop an understanding of a product like Dense Covering to help achieve the desired outcome.

- How to utilize cosmetics for the desired outcome without overuse
- Utilizing Dense Covering along with cosmetics
- Minimizing bleeding through of postmortem stain following cosmetic application
- Mixing different cosmetics for desired color
- Utilization of dry wash in cosmetic application
- Brushes and brush strokes
- Finishing details



STEPHEN BLEVINS is a 2nd generation licensed funeral service professional in the Commonwealth of Virginia and has been for 20+ years. He received his degree in Funeral Service Science in 2005 and actively worked in the funeral service industry as a full-time funeral director and embalmer for a mid-sized firm in West Virginia and as a trade embalmer for several funeral homes in the area on an asneeded basis. Since March of 2020, Stephen has taken on the role of a Dodge Sales Representative in Virginia and West Virginia. He is still actively spending time in the prep room as well as taking care of his clients.

Bariatric Embalming- More and more often, funeral service practitioners are called to prepare the remains of individuals who have been overweight or morbidly obese throughout their lives or at the time of death. Regardless of how long they struggled with obesity, certain procedures must be employed to properly prepare such individuals so that the embalming process is both thorough and ensures optimum preservation. Caring for such individuals doesn't leave room for shortcuts or sloppy embalming techniques.

Crawl Before You Walk - Mortuary Cosmetics: A Back to Basics Response - No matter how long one has been involved with preparation of deceased individuals, there always seems to be a little more difficulty in cosmetizing males. Sometimes the frustration that is encountered is simply occasioned by the fact that most people are not used to seeing males wearing makeup or when cosmetics are required to achieve a pleasant memory picture or mask postmortem stains. Through a thorough understanding of the basics of mortuary cosmetics, it is hoped that everyone will gain more confidence in their skill set and feel confident that their work meets the needs of the families they are called upon to serve.

Melinda has been the Organ, Eye, and Tissue Donation Lead Partner Liaison at LifeSource for 20 years. She is a licensed mortician in Minnesota and Michigan. She holds a bachelor's degree in Mortuary Science from the University of Minnesota. Melinda is the Chair of Donate Life America Funeral Service Committee and a member of MN FDA, ND FDA, SD FDA and Arrowhead FDA.

Tamela is the OneLegacy Funeral Home Liaison serving seven counties in southern California. She holds an Associates of Science Degree in Math and Science from the College of the Canyons and is a graduate of Cypress College of Mortuary Science. She is a licensed funeral director, embalmer, crematory manager and limited lines insurance agent in California.



Navigating the Challenges of Tissue Recovery: Roadmap to Effective Preservation, Restoration and Results - This presentation will focus on embalming and restorative technique for post-tissue recovery. Participants will gain practical insights into the care of tissue donors and the necessary supplies needed at funeral homes. Tamala and Melinda will also emphasize the importance of surgical techniques during recovery and how these techniques can affect the embalming process. The goal is to address the concerns of funeral service practitioners and explore ways to enhance relationships through education, training, and support.



NATHAN SHAW earned his bachelor's degree in Mortuary Science from Wayne State University. He has been a licensed funeral director and embalmer since 2007. He is currently the Dodge Sales Representative in Eastern Michigan and "The Thumb".

Challenging Cases... Overcoming The Obstacles - 2025 - This session will be interactive and based on a case Nathan recently embalmed, concentrating on the challenges of edema and postmortem stain coverage while applying cosmetics, and showing all the steps taken to reach the final result. Nathan will also share with us some of the different techniques and skills he acquired while working at one of Detroit's busiest funeral homes for 18 years.



TOM SHERMAN has 25+ years experience working in the funeral industry. He earned a diploma in Mortuary Science from the Commonwealth Institute of Funeral Service Houston in 2003, and has been a licensed funeral director and embalmer since 2005. He also holds a BSBA and MBA from Western Governor's University. Tom has been the Dodge Sales Representative for the Central and West Texas area since 2013.

Non-Toxic Formaldehyde-Free Embalming Is Here... And It Works! - In the world of embalming, formaldehyde, justly or not, is becoming more and more maligned in the public opinion. At the same time, many embalmers are unsure about changing what has worked for them for over a century, so they push back against utilizing non-toxic non-formaldehyde chemicals in their work. As the ever changing consumer market changes, the funeral business has to learn to adjust or at least be willing to learn about new techniques to serve their client families. Fortunately, there is a non-toxic non-formaldehyde embalming chemical available, and it has shown to provide just as high quality and long-lasting results as formaldehyde-based embalming. In this presentation funeral directors and embalmers will be shown the results of this embalming chemical to provide confidence that it is a service they can provide to their client families.
