DESCRIPTION

Dry Wash is a fast-drying, degreasing solvent with a variety of convenient uses in the prep room. Use it to remove or thin many varieties of cosmetics. Also an excellent stain remover. As with any stain removing solvent, one should test a hidden part of the fabric first before using on a visible area. Like all solvents, Dry Wash can attack or leave rings on a limited number of kinds of fabrics.

FEATURES

Dry Wash removes hardened or caked blood with ease. One can clean cosmetic brushes and thin cosmetic creams with this solvent. It's the best stain remover we know of. Finally, it's an excellent degreaser for hair and scalp. It dries almost instantly, leaving a natural gloss on even the dullest hair. Also helps kill maggots. Since there are many species of maggots, a few may not be as susceptible to Dry Wash as the majority. Be sure to use more than a light application. Killing of maggots requires that they be immersed or nearly so in the liquid.

APPLICATIONS

Dry Wash should be applied to the hair using a cotton swab or a piece of gauze. Simultaneously comb out the hair that is being cleaned. Use a metal or bone comb only; do not use rubber or plastic combs with Dry Wash. Dry Wash will also remove cradle cap. Allow Dry Wash to work for a few moments. Then remove the white material with the pad with which you applied Dry Wash. Dry Wash removes caked blood and stains, again when applied with a swab. Use it to thin oil-based cosmetics or remove cosmetic spots from clothing or casket lining.
