POTENTIAL HEALTH EFFECTS:

Signs and symptoms of short-term (acute) exposure

- Inhalation* : May cause severe irritation to the nose, throat and respiratory tract. May cause headache, nausea or weakness.
- Skin* : May cause moderate skin irritation. Skin contact causes yellow discoloration which fades with time (normally in less than one week).
- Eyes* : Direct contact causes severe irritation and possibly eye injury
- Ingestion* : May cause irritation of mouth, throat, and stomach. Symptoms may include pain, headache, nausea, vomiting, dizziness, drowsiness and other central nervous system effects. May be fatal if very large amounts are swallowed.

SECTION 4 - FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation : Immediately remove person to fresh air. If irritation persists, seek prompt medical attention.

- Skin contact** : Immediately flush with plenty of water, while removing contaminated clothing. If irritation or symptoms develop, seek medical attention. Wash contaminated clothing before re-use.
- Eye contact** : Immediately flush eyes with plenty of water for at least 15 minutes. Obtain medical attention immediately.
- Ingestion** : Call a physician or Poison Control Centre immediately. Do NOT induce vomiting. Do not give liquids to drink.

SECTION 5 - FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Fire hazards/conditions of flammability

- : Not flammable under normal conditions of use. If water is evaporated, material can burn. Vapours are heavier than air and collect in confined and low-lying areas. Closed containers may rupture if exposed to excess heat or flame due to a build-up of internal pressure.

SECTION 6 - ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

- Personal precautions** : Restrict access to area until completion of clean-up. Keep all other personnel upwind and away from the spill/release. Individuals involved in the cleanup must wear appropriate personal protective equipment. Refer to protective measures listed in sections 7 and 8.
- Environmental precautions** : Ensure spilled product does not enter drains, sewers, waterways, or confined spaces. If necessary, dike well ahead of the spill to prevent runoff into drains, sewers, or any natural waterway or drinking supply.
- Spill response/cleanup** : Remove all sources of ignition. Ventilate area of release. Stop the spill at source if it is safe to do so. Contain and absorb spilled material with inert, non-combustible absorbent material, such as sand. Pick up and transfer to properly labelled containers. Refer to Section 13 for disposal of contaminated material. Notify the appropriate authorities as required.

SECTION 7 - HANDLING AND STORAGE

- Safe Handling procedures** : Wear chemically resistant protective equipment during handling. Use only in well-ventilated areas. Do not breathe vapours or spray mist. Avoid contact with skin, eyes and clothing. Avoid repeated or prolonged exposure to full strength solution, as sensitization may develop. Keep away from heat and sources of ignition. Use in covered containers whenever possible to avoid evaporation and minimize odour. Keep away from bases and incompatibles. Keep heated solution in covered container until cooled. Wash thoroughly after handling.

- Storage requirements** : Keep heated solution in covered container until cooled. Store in a cool, dry, well-ventilated area. Store away from incompatible materials. Storage area should be clearly identified, clear of obstruction and accessible only to trained and authorized personnel. Inspect periodically for damage or leaks.
- Incompatible materials** : Oxidizing agents, acids, alcohols and amines. Alkalies catalyze an aldol-type condensation that is exothermic, but not expected to be violent.
- Special packaging materials** : Always keep in containers made of the same materials as the supply container.
